I first met Stan Kurtz via the Internet when a parent forwarded me a video link saying "you have to see this!" And they were right. Every parent, clinician and researcher whose lives have been touched by autism needs to see for themselves how our children can improve. For too long autism has been perceived as a genetically based psychiatric disorder with no known cause and no effective treatments. With this mindset, the medical needs of children with autism have been completely overlooked. But recent research has found that many children with autism also suffer with other treatable medical conditions like ulcerative colitis, immune system abnormalities, chronic viral infections, disordered serum chemistries and body burdens of environmental toxicants like mercury and lead. Stan's documentary points out how simply addressing these underlying medical conditions can result in marked improvement in the child's behavior, some to the point of complete recovery from autism.

Every 20 minutes a child is diagnosed with autism. More children will be diagnosed this year with autism than AIDS, cancer and diabetes combined! At present autism occurs in 1 in every 150 children, touches one in every 68 families in the U.S. and costs 90 billion dollars annually. Stan's dedication to getting the message out that autism is treatable is paramount to helping an entire generation of children have the opportunity to improve the quality of their lives. Ethan's recovery video has been shown to several leading directors and researchers at the National Institutes of Health in an effort to direct funding and investigation into this promising area. His

efforts have helped to turn the tides that autism need not be a lifelong disability for our children. Hopeless is now hopeful.
